

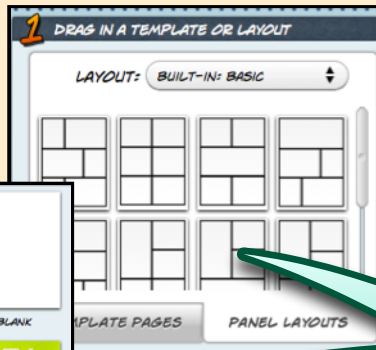
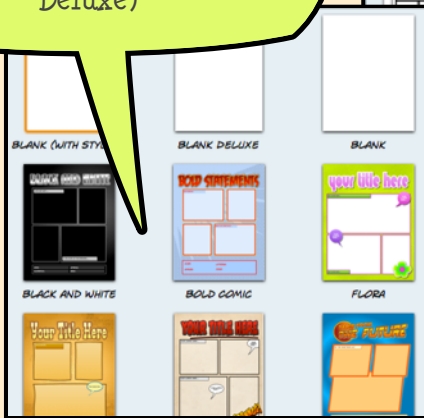


Make your own Classroom Creation

Getting Started...

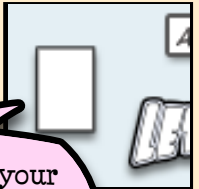

To start, you can pick from one of the pre-made templates, or you can start from scratch and choose a blank one (I like Blank Deluxe)



OR

Start from scratch. Drag your own panels in and customize your page yourself. They are located on the bottom near the speech bubbles.



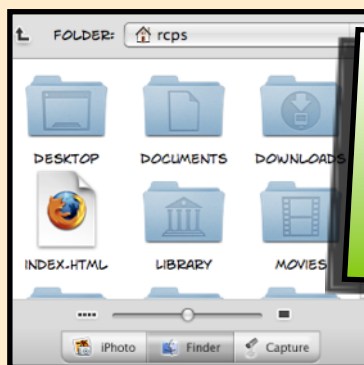
OR

Choose from over 200 Templates... Just drag and drop onto your page. Panels are completely customizable once you get them in. YOU can add, delete, or change the size and style.

Adding Pictures...

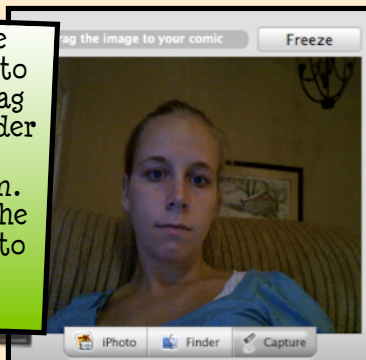


Add pictures from google images or any other website just by clicking and dragging into a panel



When under "Libraries," select "finder" at the bottom and you can drag any image file saved to your computer.

You can even use the camera on most Macs to Capture images and drag them into a panel. Under "Libraries" select "Capture" at the bottom. Click "Freeze" to take the picture, then drag it onto your page.



If you keep your images in iPhoto, Comic Life automatically connects to that library and it's easy to drag your images in. Under "Libraries" select "iPhoto" at the bottom.



Adding Text...

Regular Text Box

Once you drag this in, you can change the look of the box or take off the border using the "Style" icon in the toolbar. You can edit the text using the toolbar (picture shown below).



Fancy Lettering

To use the fancy lettering, Drag that option onto your page. Type a short title (has to be able to fit onto one line). You can then change the way the letters look by using the "Style" option from the toolbar. Letters are completely customizable using the toolbar at the top of your page.

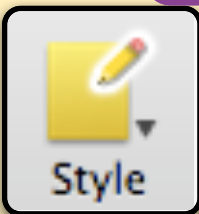


Adding Speech Bubbles...



Drag any of the speech bubbles from the bottom menu onto your page. Type the text you want. Once you've typed your text, you can resize and reshape your bubble however you like. You can also change the way the bubble looks by using the "Style" menu above. You can drag the tail wherever you like, or you can hide it behind the bubble.

Editing Anything...



Any object on your page can be edited by clicking on it. You can then click on "Style" in the toolbar to get many different options for changing the way an object looks, even the background. There are many neat options for changing the way a picture looks.

Toolbar

The toolbar located near the top of the page gives you further options for editing a selected object. You can change the color of ANYTHING. You can also change the frames, shadows, and fonts using this option.

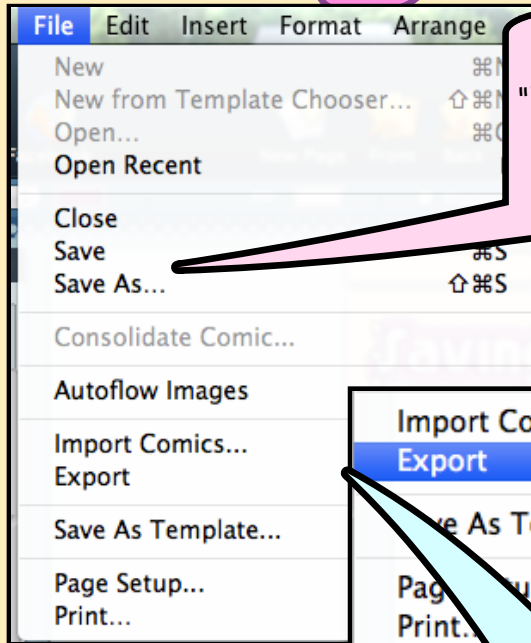


The Inspector menu gives you some fine tuning options. One I really like is customizing shadows.

Final Thought...

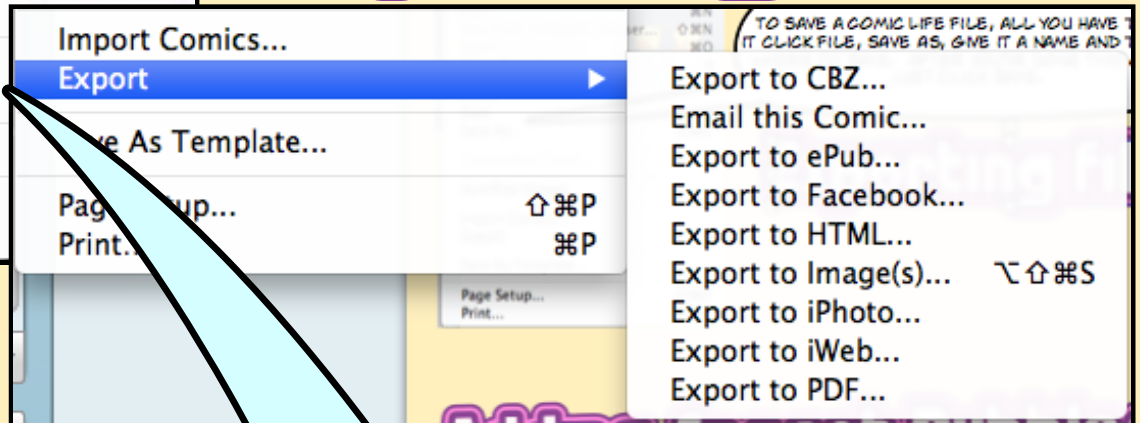
The only thing that limits your abilities in comic life is your own creativity.

Saving files...



To save a Comic Life file, all you have to do is click "File", "Save As", give it a name, and tell it where to save. After you've done this once, just click save the next time.

Exporting files...



You also have some options for exporting in other formats. Click "File" and "Export"
Here are two options I find Most useful:

PDF

When you have a finished page, you may want to be able to email it or put it on a web page. Most people don't have Comic Life on their computers, so they wouldn't be able to open it. If you Export it as a PDF, others will be able to view it.

Image:

You can export your finished page as an image for a variety of reasons: Others can open it if they don't have comic life, you may want to put a page you made into a Powerpoint, I have even had yearbook teachers have kids make pages and put the image in the yearbook.
